Just some tips for the summer:

Protect everyone from the sun. When out in the sun, everyone should wear sunscreen with a Sun Protection Factor (SPF) of 15 or higher. This includes children and infants! Clothing also protects from the sun. Light-weight and light colored cover-ups are good. Consider sunglasses to protect your eyes from the rays of the sun. Hats will cover the head and neck from the sun.

But **DO NOT FORGET** to apply sunscreen on any exposed skin.

If you go camping or are out in the woods, check everyone for ticks. They carry many diseases.

When attending picnics, be aware of the foods, especially any made with salad dressings or mayonnaise. These should be kept cold until time to eat. If they have been sitting out for more than a half hour in the warm air,

DO NOT eat. You could become sick with food poisoning. When making a salad for a picnic, consider using oil-based dressings.

Do not allow children to play with fireworks. Fireworks-related injuries most frequently involved hands and fingers, head and face, and burns. Go and enjoy fireworks, which are put off by experts, at your local community displays.

Fate of the Revolutionaries

We call them heroes. The British called them traitors. Many of them turned out to be martyrs. Here is what happened to some of the 56 men who signed the Declaration of Independence.

- ◆ Five were captured and tortured as traitors.
- ◆ Nine joined the revolutionary army, fought and died.
- ◆ Eight men had property looted by the British army or by vandals.
- ◆ One signer's home was taken over by a British general. The

owner, Thomas Nelson Jr., asked General Washington to burn the home down. The general did.

- ◆ The home of Francis Lewis was destroyed and his wife put in jail. She died shortly thereafter.
- ◆ Three men had their fields and mills destroyed.

In one way or another, all of the men paid a dear price as a result of their rebellion. Still they were faithful to the pledge they made on July 4, 1776:

“We, therefore, the

Representatives of the United States of America, in General Congress, Assembled, appealing to the Supreme Judge of the world for the rectitude of our intentions, do, in the Name, and by the Authority of the good People of these Colonies, solemnly publish and declare, That these United Colonies are, and of Right ought to be Free and Independent States And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives,

our Fortunes and our sacred Honor.
